

- 1) Completing 15 semester hours of college-level reading coursework based upon scientific reading research with a focus on both the prevention and remediation of reading difficulties. - 2) Completing the coursework through a district's approved reading endorsement add-on plan. Reach out to your district's main Professional Learning Contact for more information.
