Your Right to Know

ESEA directs schools and districts to notify pare also ut four key requirements of a Title I, Part A program

- 1. Professional qualifications of teachers and paraprofessionals who instruct
- 2. Notification if your child's teacher is not highly qualified
- 3. Individual report card that lets you know how your child is progressing
- 4. Notification that the school has entered school improvementatise its students did nontake Adequate Yearly Progress-meet the state standard in math or reading or both—for two scheelers a row.

Your Right to Know — Professional Qualifications of Teachers

Parents of children, who attend schools that receive Title I, Part A funding, have the right to request and receive Title I, Part A funding, have the right to request and receive information about the qualifications of the educators who teach their children core subjects ing, English language arts and mathematics. The ame applies to paraprofessionals who instruct.
